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ISA Art & Design present "Sustained Rest", featuring five Indonesian and one Japanese artists. The five featured artists are, A. Sebastianus, Bonggal Hutagalung, Galih Adika, Yuki Nakayama and Yusra Martunus.

The title of this exhibition comes from a term commonly used in musical engineering. Sustained is a parameter of time indicating a period where the sound persists before becoming inaudible or silent. Rest in musical terms is to stop or be silent; what remains is an object that does not move. Sustained Rest is an object that remains silent or a state of silence. However, sustained rest can still be heard and felt when presented.

The 'Sustained Rest' exhibition presents the substance of several artists with different creative mediums and materials used in the selection of works with color harmony. This exhibition seeks to create color harmony and tension between the object and the medium, with the diversity of the mediums owned by the artists through harmonization in color. Color plays an essential role in influencing a person's moods, emotions, sensations, and perceptions, which can offer the possibility of multifaceted interpretation.

The exhibition will be using Jung's theory, Heidegger's theory, and Tactile Space theory to convey the sensations of their works that are present to form perception. Eventually, these sensory receptions will continue to become a well-stored memory through the works of sustained rest, color, and space harmony.






Yuki Nakayama is an artist born and raised in Okinawa, Japan. In 2008, she decided to move to New York to pursue her passion for the arts. Graduated from Parsons the New School for Design, she studied interior design where she began exploring spaces of play in the domestic and public environment. As her interest grew to larger scales, she graduated from The Cooper Union, where she studied architecture. Before coming back to Okinawa, she lived in New York for over ten years.

Fascinated by playground architecture, her work is influenced and motivated by its history and urgency. She believes that play is the foundation of being; from the moment you are born, it is our inherit tool for survival. Moving between tangible three dimensional spaces and two dimensional drawings, her interest lays in the spaces that are perhaps lost in translation. Painting came naturally as a medium that bridges the difference. Visualizing new spaces within the gaps of architectural representation, her work focuses on the intimacy of play. Gestures of spaces are painted in bold, while the lines carve out details that invite multiple perspectives to viewers. The speckles of colors inhabit these spaces as they highlight each territory. She intends to continue to use painting as a tool to explore the built environment



Yusra Martunus (b. 1973, Padangpanjang) is an Indonesian artist whose known for his creative ideas and various use of mediums to convey meaningful narratives. He studied at the Indonesian Institute of The Arts, Yogyakarta (Institut Seni Indonesia Yogyakarta) majoring in Fine Arts. He is one of the co-founders of an art group in Indonesia, Jendela Art Group (Kelompok Seni Rupa Jendela). Jendela Art Group brings new perspective in art combining art and sensory play in the creative process and the purpose of art when the art world in Indonesia was rampant with the chaotic discourse of sociopolitical messaging and the struggle to find a post-colonial identity. Martunus also uses materials of his medium to create unlikely metaphors that complicate its meaning. He disturbs people's perceptions of material and forms. He was awarded the Best of McDonald Art Award in1994,TheBest of Indonesia Asean Art Award in 2003 and was a finalist at the Asian Art Awards in 2004.

ALEXANDER SEBASTIANUS



Alexander Sebastianus Hartanto (b. 1995) sees ethnographic research as an experiential mode of existence. His works explore the decontextualization of material cultures and how they are perceived, understood and ritualized in practice. For Sebastianus, decolonizing the ontologies of art is to reclaim *Sani*, a way of living that involves offering, service and search of the unknown. Such a practice leads to a recreation of pilgrimages, sacred spaces and woven cloths, all of which may or may not be archived, documented or shared. In *Sani*, what is left are remnants and evidence of materials.

A. Sebastianus Hartanto is an artist who achieved the William Daley Award for Excellence in Art History and Craft in 2017. Trained as an apprentice in his grandmother's hometown in East Java, he mastered the art of weaving, which has become essential in his exploration of visual and material ontology. Currently he works at Rumah Sukkha Citta in Java as an ethnographer and developer of textile crafts.
